READY TO DRIVE? For Teenage Drivers



A <u>court ruling</u> allows 16 and 17 year-olds living in Ohio with undocumented immigrant parents to obtain their driver's permit and license. Follow the steps below to learn how!



Step 1 Driver's Permit

By age 15 and a half,* you can receive a <u>temporary permit</u>. To do so, you must first pass the vision and written exams. Then, you will need to pay the <u>permit fees</u> and present the <u>required</u> <u>documents.</u>

Step 2

Driver's Education

Before getting an Ohio <u>driver's license</u> in 6 months, you must first sign up, pay for, and complete a <u>24-hour course,</u> 8 hours of driving with an instructor, and 50 hours of driving with a licensed adult.

Step 3 Driver's License

To take the <u>Driver's Exam</u> at an <u>eligible BMV</u>, you must bring your: completed Driver's Education Certificate, signed statement confirming 50 hours of driving, your permit, and the <u>license fees.</u>

*NOTE: If you are younger than 18, you will have to have a parent, guardian, or another adult with you to apply for your permit.

A <u>court ruling</u> allows your 16 and 17 year-old children to obtain their driver's permit and license in Ohio, regardless of your immigration status.



Follow the steps below to learn how!



Children under 18 with U.S. citizenship or lawful presence can get a state ID card. A state ID card is not valid for driving a vehicle. You will need to sign their electronic application and show a form of identification:

- Driver's License
- Ohio Identification (ID) Card
- Birth Certificate
- U.S. or Foreign Passport
- Foreign ID or Consular ID



If your child is under the age of 18, they will need you (or another person who is willing to take financial responsibility of them) to sign their electronic application, present a form of identification (see examples listed to the left) and complete the Co-Signer Liability form.
